The magazine's ranking was determined in partnership with the Calvert Research and Management arm of Eaton Vance (EV). Calvert Research and Management analyzed 1,000 of the largest publicly traded companies headquartered in the U.S. Medidata is ranked 70th on the list.

In 2018, Medidata's goal is to hold global volunteer events throughout the year with at least 80% of employees volunteering in their communities worldwide.
